Green Fees Now Due

Green fees are now due for 2026/2027. The committee have reviewed our annual commitments (estate green areas, tree maintenance, our Gardener contracts). We are please to update that no tree maintenance work is required, however will be monitored for any issues. It is also noted that there was no damage to any trees over the winter due to the previous work carried out. **Many thanks to Steven for all his work with the tree surgeon!** **To that end, annual fees for 2026/2027 have been set at £140.**

We are requesting that all residents use the **Faster Payment** option via their internet banking again this year. Please see enclosed invoice for details. Green Fees should be paid no later than **Thursday 30th April 2026.**

If any residents have any concerns about paying Green Fees

in full by the payment date, please contact the treasurer via the email detailed below as soon as possible, but no later than 16th April.

If you are not responsible for paying this fee, please ensure that a copy of this newsletter and invoice are forwarded to the responsible person.

Late Payment Fee

Last year (as in previous years) a number of residents did not make payment by the due date. It was necessary for the committee to issue a number of payment reminders, which incurs extra expenses. To encourage payment on time, the committee have agreed that a late payment fee of **£10** will be charged in the event that payment due reminders are issued. This late payment fee will be applied for each reminder issued (i.e. 2 reminders will result in a £20 late payment fee). As a reminder, our committee are a team of volunteers.

Please be fair and pay on time.

Green Fees vs Factoring Fees

The Green Fees are in lieu of a factoring service on the estate. It is generally considered to be more cost effective for all homeowners, with neighboring estates paying annual factor management fees in excess of our green fees plus variable extra costs each month as additional work is completed. Management of common green areas is undertaken by the volunteers on the residents association committee. For more information on what happens with your green fees, please visit our website.

Pest Control

We're hearing reports of a number of rats or squirrel infestations in the local area. If you suspect you have vermin in your area, take action now! Contact Glasgow City Council Pest Control by calling **0141 287 1059** and select option 4 (other contact options are available in the GCC App). Please don't encourage vermin by leaving food out or providing a cosy home in a rubbish pile in your garden!

Love Where You Live

Litter on the estate continues to be a problem, particularly in the green spaces. This can make our estate look untended, but may encourage further littering and vermin.

We can all play our part in maintaining the estate. Remember, your bins should not be overflowing when you leave them out for the bin lorry, lift litter if you see it on our streets or common areas and place it in the nearest bin. Please check and clear any litter which may have accumulated around your house over the winter months.



There has been deliberate damage to some trees in the estate by breaking branches, tying ropes to or nailing fences to trees. We ask residents to refrain from doing this, as further tree maintenance will need to be paid for and may result in higher fees next year.

Dumb Dumpers



Fly tipping is an increasingly common problem and one that our estate is not immune to. Fly-tipping is waste that is disposed of illegally and irresponsibly, it can include anything from a single black bag of household or garden waste to large volumes of tyres or construction waste. If you are undertaking any home or garden works, please ensure you dispose of your waste responsibly or use a reputable contractor who will dispose of your waste in an appropriate way.

If you witness fly tipping on or around our estate, we encourage you to report it to Dumb Dumpers or via the Glasgow City Council App.

No such thing as a dog poo fairy...



Whatever some people may believe, there's no such thing as the dog poo fairy. Dog fouling – whether loose or bagged – is offensive, disgusting and a potential health hazard. Bag it

and bin it and if you see someone not cleaning up after their dog, report it via the Glasgow City Council App

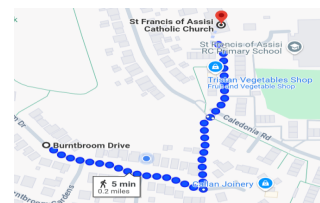
Twenty's Plenty

You can download the Glasgow City Council mobile app from your App Store and complete registration for online access to a wide array of council services. This includes requests for bulk uplifts, reporting fly tipping or dog fouling as

well as broken street lights, pot holes and requesting a grit bin refill. You'll even find the rubbish collection calendar...if you forget when purple bin day is!



Report It

We would encourage you to report any maintenance (pot holes or street lights) issues to the council as soon as they arise on the estate. It only takes 5 minutes and the more of us that report it, the more likely it is to get fixed quickly!
